Procedures:

To honor superior academic achievement, graduation ceremonies shall include recognition of valedictorian(s) and salutatorian(s). Valedictorian(s) and salutatorian(s) shall be selected based on established criteria and procedures that use multiple measures of academic performance.

The Director or designee shall perform a calculation of grade point averages (GPA) as described below. The top 10% of Senior GPAs identified by the student information system will provide the foundation for consideration of review. At the Director's discretion, valedictorian(s) and salutatorian(s) may be designated for the entire school or at each resource center providing a high school program.

- Coursework for the seven semesters through the fall semester of the Senior Year will count towards the calculation. A progress report will be submitted in Learning Period 8 to verify continued successful progress in rigorous coursework. The Director will have sole discretion in the final evaluation dependent upon the progress report.
- Students must be enrolled in LVCS for at least 2 semesters.
- Grade weighting shall be applied to (when available) Advanced Placement, honors, a-g designation, and/or concurrent postsecondary courses.
- Weighting of courses shall be on the following scale:
 - A = 5.0
 - B = 4.0
 - C = 3.0
 - Grades below C shall not receive additional weighting.
- Consistent with the CSU/UC system GPA calculation, courses considered for the GPA calculation include:
 - Mathematics Algebra I and higher
 - Sciences
 - World History, US History, Economics, US Government
 - English
 - Visual/Performing Arts
 - Foreign Language
- CST Scores for 9th, 10th and 11th grades will be averaged. An average score of advanced will count as 1 additional point added to the GPA; an average score of Proficient will count as 0.5 additional points added to the GPA. Average scores below proficient shall not qualify for the additional points.
- Students must be on track to meet all LVCS graduation requirements and have passed the CAHSEE in 10th grade.
